
In these paintings I have responded to the motif of trees, using a practice that allows the subject to point its own pathway through the making of the painting. I wanted to find imaginative ways to develop each painting according to the prompts of the motif itself. This open approach resulted in paintings that differ in language as I try to remain receptive to the possibilities of each subject.

Forests have long been my focus. I find the beguiling interaction of trees with one another a delight to my eye, the character of the individual tree capable of moving my affections, and the synthesis of the whole compelling.


I have begun most of these paintings in front of the motif *en plein air*, and continued the forming of the painting in the studio. Often a solution has to be found by once again setting up the easel in front of the complexity and the chaos of the living subject. It has been a matter of finding the right way for each painting, when to work from life and when to work on the painting surface.

I have felt drawn to the visual complexity of the bush, trees in profusion presenting a rich field for abstraction. In the intriguing relation of forms there is pleasure for the painter's eye, subtlety as well as intricacy, abstraction as well as accepted appearance.

Painting will always be an assembly of colours, tones and marks on a canvas, yet I also want the colours, tones and marks to form a real correspondence with my subjective experience. I want not only a visual resolution in the painting but a poetic realisation of my engagement with the subject, in this case the way of trees and forest.








